
# KAYSPAYS BEAFF

than those with only a high school diploma.




Exercise Rates Among Adults Ages 25–34, by Education Level, 2008 Sources: NCHS, 2008 National Health Interview Survey.

than those with only a high school diploma.



Individuals with only a high school diploma are **about twice as likely to be unemployed** as those with a college degree.




Unemployment Rates of Individuals Ages 25 and Older, by Education Level, 2009 Source: Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2010c.
